The goal of the Concussion Care Program at Flagstaff Bone and Joint is to raise awareness about the dangers of sports related brain injuries among athletes in Northern Arizona and to provide proper concussion treatment. It is recommended that all athletes in a high impact sport complete a baseline test that can be used to compare post-injury test results to if the athlete experiences a concussion. It is recommended that the athletes in the following sports receive ImPACT baseline testing: \*Football \*Cheer \*Rugby \*Soccer \*Wrestling
