The number of FUSD schools identified as Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) by ADE will be reduced by the 2020-2021 school year as a result of improved achievement of student subgroups. 11 of 15 schools were identified in December 2018.
		By the 2019-2020 school year, the achievement gaps of Low SES and SPED students will be reduced compared to the overall achievement of students as measured by AzMERIT, AIMS and ACT.
		The diversity in race/ethnicity and gender of students enrolled in higher level coursework will more closely reflect the demographics of the overall school enrollment by the 2020-2021 school year as measured by the disaggregated enrollment in AP courses, Dual Enrollment, Coconino Institute of Technology (CIT), APEX (MEMS), MIT-E (SMS), and the Elementary Preparatory Academy.
		By the 2019-2020 school year, the diversity (race/ethnicity and gender) of applicants to FUSD staff positions will more closely reflect the demographics of FUSD's overall student enrollment.
		The percent of FUSD students graduating within four years of enrolling in high school will increase from 86.9 percent to 90 percent as reported on the AZ School Report Cards in 2021 (Cohort 2020).
