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MILITARY CAREERS & GAP YEARS

Military

- Career options within each branch of the Military
- Provide training and educational opportunities for selected career
- Military representatives will be in the South Commons during lunch
- Both students and parents need to be involved in the process
- Recommend taking ASVAB in November

- Gap years can provide opportunities for individual growth
- Can explore careers, humanitarian & mission service, travel, caring for others
- Add experiences to resume

COLLEGE OPTIONS

Universities

- Public & Private universities
- Each location is unique
- In-state offers affordable tuition & competitive merit aid
- Out-of-State offers more options, such as size and environment, along with merit aid

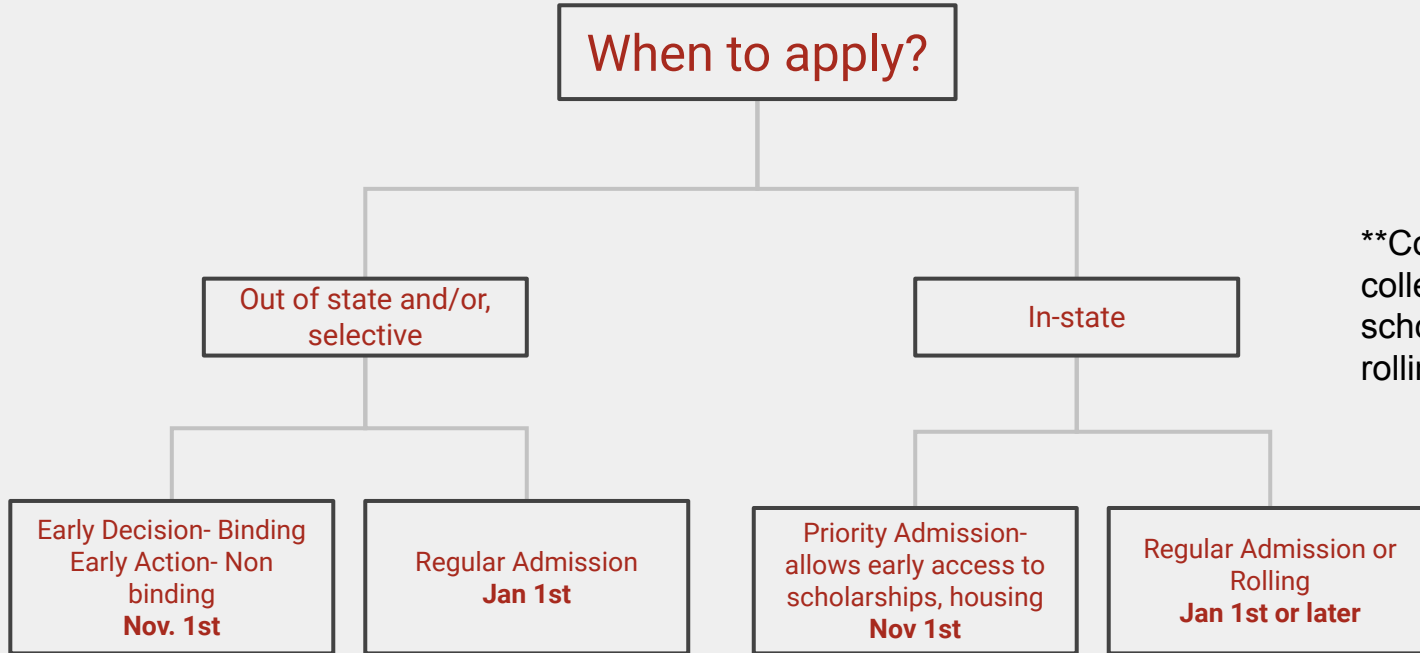
Community/Junior Colleges

- Local & nationwide options
- Affordable
- Some offer on-campus housing
- Seamless transition to universities (CCC2NAU)
- Open to all students
- Offer certificates and Associate's degrees

Trade/Technical Colleges

- Vary in size, cost, program length/availability & location
- Many are private
- Can be financial aid/FAFSA eligible
- Some offer housing
- Tuition partnerships with employers





****Community colleges, trade/tech schools have rolling admission.**



APPLYING TO In-State COLLEGES

Application open for: **ASU, NAU, UA**

- Apply on Colleges website
- Self report** (transcript not required)
- Honors College? Separate application
- When application is submitted, automatically considered for admission & merit scholarship
- ACT or SAT not needed, but may aid in scholarships or admissions

**Self-report grades- admissions and merit scholarships based on “Sweet 16 or CORE” credits & GPA (except NAU*)

4 years of English
4 years of Math
2 years of Social Studies (1 year of US History)
2 years of Lab Science
1 year of Fine Art/CTE
2 years of Modern Language*

APPLYING TO Out-of-State COLLEGES

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- **Directly to the institution**
 - Application on college website
 - First year, apply button
- ONE application
 - Sent to multiple schools
- Please inform school counselor
- Link Common App to Major Clarity

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What do you need to apply?

- ❑ Copy of transcript or StudentVUE Course History, to self-report grades
- ❑ Test scores (optional but encouraged)
- ❑ Demographic information (DOB, SS#, Address)
- ❑ Payment for application
 - ❑ Fee waiver for students who qualify for Free Reduced Lunch (FRL).

Some colleges have additional requirements:

- ❑ Letters of recommendations (2-3 from teachers & counselor)
- ❑ Essays
- ❑ List of activities, work, community service
- ❑ Academic Honors and Achievements

Request official transcripts on Major Clarity.

AP scores- send directly from CollegBoard to the college.

DE classes- transcript must be requested from CCC.



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How do I pay for college?



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Scholarships

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Merit based

- Determined by core GPA (Sweet 16)
- Varies from each school

Need based (qualify for Pell grant)

- Arizona Promise Program (unmet need for tuition)

- Universities have foundation and school specific scholarships
- Local scholarships- will announce in StudentVue email or newsletter
- Regional scholarships- newsletter

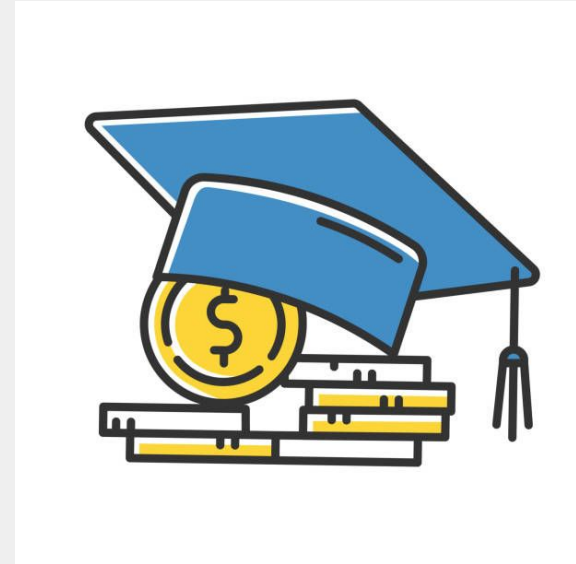
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[Questbridge](#)- full ride scholarship for highly selective colleges, need based

[Elks Most Valuable](#)- Award amounts 1,000-7,500

[Dorrance](#) (opens October 1st)- \$12,000 per year for 1st gen students who demonstrate financial need (3.0 GPA minimum)

Financial Aid– FAFSA

Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

- Application requires parent(s) tax information and student (if applicable)
- Determines if student qualifies for federal money for Grants, Work Study and Federal Loans.
- All roles must have a FSA ID
- Filled out every year

Important changes to FAFSA

- Opens in December
- The terms Roles and Contributors (Parents) will be used
- Must use IRS Data Retrieval Tool
- All sections must be signed

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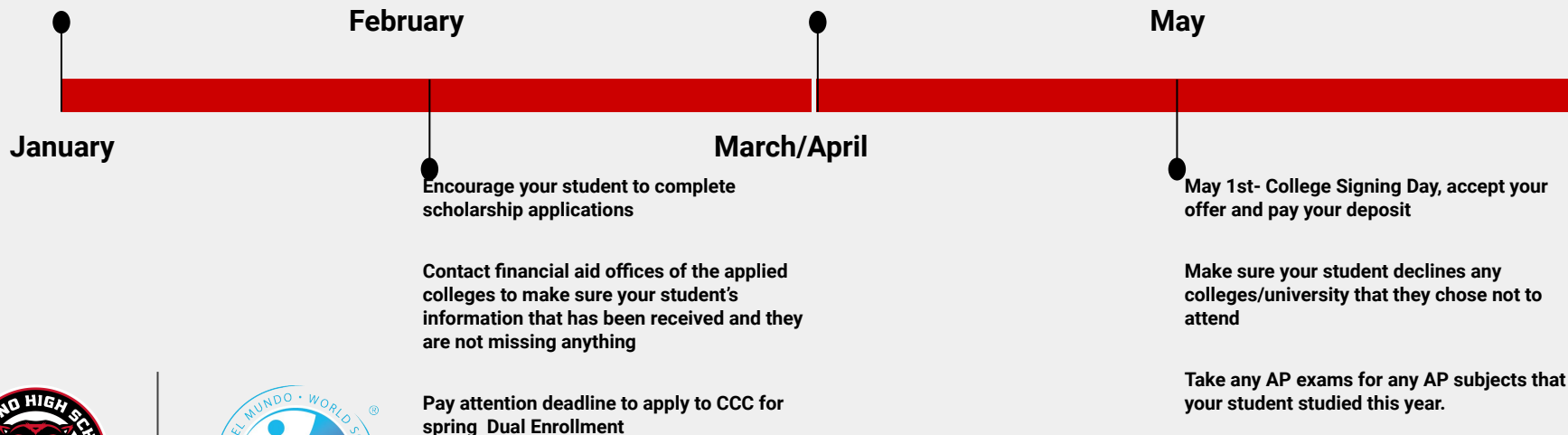
Make sure transcripts have been requested and sent to colleges/universities your student is applying to (if required)

Contact admissions offices to make sure they have everything they need

Your student will probably have heard from the colleges/university as to whether or not they have been accepted by April 15th

Compare acceptance letters, financial aid packages and scholarship offers and **MAKE THE DECISION!**

This guide includes helpful links for college planning during your senior year.

FALL

- Research colleges, you can use Major Clarity *Postsecondary Exploration* to help you. Click on comparison tool to help you narrow down your choices.
- Create your list of Colleges that you are applying to. You can use this [College Application Checklist](#) from CollegeBoard to help you keep track of deadlines and tasks.
- If needed, retake the ACT and/or SAT. Some colleges are still test optional, however, some may require test scores for admissions and/or merit based scholarships.
- If applying to in-state schools, apply directly to the institution. If applying to multiple and highly selective colleges, you may need to use the Common App. Please see your school counselor if using Common App.
- Keep track of deadlines- Early decision/early action applications are due as soon as possible or by November 1st.
- Letters of recommendations- some colleges/universities require letters of recommendations, please ask your teachers and school counselor 2-3 weeks in advance to write a letter. Please provide a resume and/or brag sheet. Non-Common App users, use Major Clarity to request letters of recommendations for colleges.

Next testing date: October 7th, late registration Sept. 26th

Cost: \$60
