Flagstaff Unified School District Dress Code and Panther Attire

We all share the responsibility of assuring that the CHS school atmosphere is conducive to learning and promotes an environment of respect. Basic rules of sanitation, safety, neatness and modesty must be observed. CHS expects students to wear clothing that is appropriate to the business of learning and not a distraction to others.

Students may be asked to change clothes if the clothing is deemed inappropriate by staff. Staff discretion will determine appropriateness.

1st Violation: Upon the first violation, students will be reminded of the dress code and be required to change into school provided clothing.

2nd Violation: Upon second violation, students will be required to call a parent or guardian to bring proper clothing to school, and students will be required to change.

3rd Violation: Further disciplinary action will be determined by Administration.

Students are expected to adhere to the following:

- Students may not wear items that advertise alcohol, drugs, tobacco products, sex, nudity, or which allude to topics inappropriate for school or considered to be offensive to others.
- Gang affiliated clothing and personal belongings deemed such by local law enforcement officials cannot be worn.
- Chains and spikes are not permitted.
- Other clothes that represent a safety hazard to school will not be permitted.
- According to Arizona Law, footwear must be worn at all times. (Slippers are not considered acceptable footwear for school.)
- Head coverings (i.e. hats, stocking caps, visors, sunglasses, bandanas, hair nets, hoods) are not allowed to be worn during the regular school day.
- Clothing should not expose areas of cleavage, upper thighs, stomach, sides or back. Visible undergarments, such as bra straps and underwear, are inappropriate. (Exposed undergarments are not permissible.)
