FHS sits on the edge of the Navajo Nation and hosts students who live in the Bureau of Indian Education (BIE) funded Kinlani Bordertown Dormitory to take advantage of an excelling educational environment that values the cultural differences of its students. Additionally, FHS boasts a 93% overall graduation rate in nearly every ethnic and socio-economic demographic that prepares each student to harness success in their post-secondary choice. Whether selecting a career or academic post secondary choice, FHS offers the course work and support to help each student succeed to their highest potential.

Important Message from the Attendance Office

When checking out a student during the school day, please call (928)773-8110 or (928)773-8111 at least 30 minutes prior to when you would like your student to sign out. If you get our voicemail please leave a message. We check the voicemails constantly throughout the day. Please leave the student's name, time you would like them to sign out, your name and relation to the student, phone number, and the reason the student is leaving. When signing out a student it is not necessary to come into the building. We will verify your information over the phone, send an Early Dismissal Slip to the student, and they will need to come sign out in the Attendance office. The State requires a time stamp when students leave campus, and if they return, a time stamp back in. If a student leaves for a medical appointment, please have them bring a note from the medical office to the Attendance office upon their return. Please be aware that if you call or come in at 2:15 or later, we

cannot guarantee that we will be able to get your student out before 2:30 as that is a very busy time of day with a lot of students leaving. Thank you!"
