Recruitment Continues for CAVIAT Central Programs-

New Programs Available for 2020-2021 School Year: CAVIAT programs are designed to offer students the technical skills needed to find meaningful and essential work. Students may use the skills learned to enter the workforce directly or to use their training and certifications to work while continuing their education. The new programs added for fall of the 2020 school year include: Computer Information Systems-which offers programing in Python, server operations and an A+ certification; Construction Technologies- creating opportunities to do building inspection, facilities management or property management; Hospitality Management-preparing students for working in hotel and property management Early Childhood Education offering students who want to pursue social work, teaching or childcare a pathway to earn early certifications and the Law and Public Safety and Security pathway creating opportunities in policing, crime scene investigation and emergency services including dispatch. In the fall, CAVIAT will continue to offer their longstanding programs in Allied Health- Pre-Health, Medical Assisting, Emergency Medical Services, Nursing Assistant and Vet Assistant. CAVIAT also has seats available in Business (accountancy), Engineering and Alternative Technologies.
