

Reading/Sight Words Choice Board

Use this choice board throughout the week. If you don't have certain items, try to get creative with what you have at home. If an activity is difficult, how could you help your student complete the activity?

<p><u>Reading</u></p> <p>Read a fiction book together as a family and discuss: characters, setting, problem and solution.</p>	<p><u>Sight Words</u></p> <p>Write your words in white crayon and then paint over them with watercolors or food coloring.</p>	<p><u>Sight Words</u></p> <p>Make sight word snowballs. Write sight words on circles on pieces of paper. Cut out the circles, crumple them up, and throw them at each other. Read sight words that are thrown to you.</p>	<p><u>Sight Words</u></p> <p>Sight word parking lot. Make a board with slots with one sight word in each slot. Make a deck of cards with the same sight words. Pick a card, read it and drive your car into the slot.</p>	<p><u>Reading</u></p> <p>Go into the kitchen and read the labels on the cans and boxes.</p>
<p><u>Reading</u></p> <p>Turn off all the lights in your room and read a book with a flashlight.</p>	<p><u>Sight Words</u></p> <p>Make cards with sight words on them. Hide them in the house. Have a word hunt.</p>	<p><u>Reading</u></p> <p>Work on the Lexia Core 5 app.</p>	<p><u>Reading</u></p> <p>Make a fort and read a book inside it.</p>	<p><u>Reading</u></p> <p>Read a book on Starfall.</p>
<p><u>Sight Words</u></p> <p>Rainbow maker: Write each sight word you are working on. Trace each letter in every color of the rainbow.</p>	<p><u>Sight Words</u></p> <p>Make and play KABOOM. Write sight words on popsicle sticks or small pieces of paper. Write KABOOM on 5 popsicle sticks/paper. Put all your sight words and KABOOMS in a container. Each player picks out 1 popsicle stick/paper and reads the sight word. If you can read it, you keep it. If you get a KABOOM put all your sight words back in the container.</p>	<p><u>Sight Words</u></p> <p>Find a set of ABCs online and print them off. Cut the letters apart and build your sight words using the letters.</p>	<p><u>Reading</u></p> <p>Work on rhyming words: Find 5 pairs of things at your house that rhyme and write them down on a list. Don't forget to illustrate them too!</p>	<p><u>Reading</u></p> <p>Read your Jolly Phonics sounds to someone in your household. Don't forget to do the movements!</p>
<p><u>Reading</u></p> <p>Read and follow directions for a fun recipe. kids recipes more ideas Don't buy anything, there's lots of recipes!</p>	<p><u>Sight Words</u></p> <p>Evaporation: Take water and a paintbrush go outside and write your sight words on the sidewalk or driveway. See how long it takes them to disappear.</p>	<p><u>Reading</u></p> <p>Read a nonfiction book together as a family. Tell your family 3 facts that you learned.</p>	<p><u>Reading</u></p> <p>Read a book and create the main character.</p>	<p><u>Sight Words</u></p> <p>Salt Tray: Put salt in the bottom of a tray or plate. Make each sight word in the salt using your finger.</p>
<p><u>Reading</u></p> <p>Read a book and draw a picture of the beginning, middle, and end.</p>	<p><u>Sight Words</u></p> <p>Draw a hopscotch board with sidewalk chalk and write sight words inside each square. As you hop in squares say your sight words.</p>	<p><u>Sight Words</u></p> <p>Play a Memory Game with your words.</p>	<p><u>Sight Words</u></p> <p>Play sight word BINGO with your words.</p>	<p><u>Reading</u></p> <p>Book Beach Party: Take a beach towel outside and read a book while laying on your towel. Don't let your book blow away!</p>
