**Below are the requirements to request for student educational assistance:**

- ✓ Native American student grades K-12, enrolled at FUSD.
- ✓ Student promotes positive behavior among peers and staff at school.
- ✓ Completed the NAESP Education Assistance/Purchase Request Form.
- ✓ Completed Title VI 506 Student Eligibility Certificate Form and/or turned in a Certificate of Indian Blood.

**Student Educational Assistance for Grades K-12**

- Eyeglasses (limit: \$100 per year)
- School supplies (Reach out to the Native American advisor or interventionists, if applicable.)
- Instructional materials for special projects (e.g., fabric, safety goggles, school/gym uniform fee)
- Musical instrument rental (\$80 per year for 1st to 8th graders)
- School-related club fees (up to 50%)
- Extracurricular activities such as sports (100% for middle school students and 50% for high school students)
- Caps and gowns (up to 50%)

**Educational Assistance for Grades 6-12**

Limit: \$100 per school year on a first-come, first-served basis. Amounts above \$100 can be requested from the Indian Education Committee.

- Prior approved education conferences (per year)
- Higher education campus visit (per year)
- Testing or project fees (e.g., ACT/SAT, AP, PSAT, IB)
- American Academy online courses (i.e., Chief Manuelito classes)

**Summer School Assistance for Grades 7-12**

Limit: \$125 per summer. PLATO classes may qualify, depending on summer school curriculum.

- 7th grade students lacking 1.0 unit of core classes to get back on track
- 8th grade students recommended for retention
- 9th & 10th grade students lacking .5 - 1.0 credit in Math/ELA to get back on track for their grade level
- 11th grade students lacking .5 - 1.0 credit to get back on track
- 12th grade students lacking .5 - 1.0 credit to graduate

**Dual Enrollment Assistance for Grades 9-12**

Limit: \$180 per school year. Amounts above \$180 is the responsibility of the student. Student must:

- Be qualified to enroll in Coconino Community College Dual Enrollment program;
- Have passed the required placement tests;
- Have a 2.0 GPA or above;
- Maintain a C or above in each course;
- Maintain good grades and class attendance; and
- Be on track with graduation credits.

*NOTE: Financial assistance is dependent upon funding availability.*

*Unallowable expenses include past dues and fees, athletic apparel, personal clothing, activity cards, yearbooks, school pictures, prom expenses, medical and/or legal expenses.*

*Payments cannot be made directly to individuals and cannot be reimbursed to individuals who have made payments out of pocket. Request may take 2-4 weeks to process.*
